



Clinical Therapist

Southeast Collegiate is the only school of its kind in all of Canada. It serves as a campus to First Nations students during the school year – educating students in a beautiful school facility and providing housing in the adjoining lodge.

We are seeking an experienced and compassionate **Clinical Therapist** to join our newly established Mental Health Unit at Southeast Collegiate.

This is a 1-year term position with the possibility of renewing, depending on various circumstances.

The first day of work will be ASAP and the last day of work will be at the end of 26 pay periods afterwards.

This is an evening shift position, with hours being 2:00 pm – 10:00 pm / 3:00 pm – 11:00 pm, and some weekends as needed.

Job Duties and Responsibilities

- Complete comprehensive assessments, considering the multiple layers (i.e., historic, generational, and current reality of First Nation Peoples), needs, disorders, concurrent substance use issues, and medical conditions for families and students.
- Recommend and implement treatment options, conduct risk assessments and develop safety plans based on Southeast's capacity assessments
- Utilize strategies to obtain commitment to therapeutic engagement, while assessing client readiness and stage of change.
- Complete a comprehensive formulation and treatment plan as a foundation for treatment, with input from collateral sources and multidisciplinary teams for integration.
- Modify treatment activities and approaches as needed to comply with changes in students' status.
- Provide intervention, with clinical outcomes to be achieved through application of evidenced-based practices with ongoing monitoring of impact.
- Focus on the client's potential for developing/sustaining pro-social, self-regulation of mental health symptoms, related behaviours (e.g. substance use, conflict management, anger management)
- Self-monitor the completion of progress/contact notes describing each client contact and how that contact relates to treatment goals and adherence to policy
- Collaborate with other members of the treatment team and participate in team meetings
- Ensures mainstream as well as traditional ways of healing are available to students

- Assess need for ongoing therapeutic services for students in care and makes recommendations for closure of services where appropriate
- Oversees the use of external treatment providers for students and families including psychological assessments to determine eligibility for CLDS (adult services)
- Travel between Winnipeg and Communities over summer months
- Other duties as assigned by Supervisor/Management
- Duties may evolve or change over time to more effectively support students and staff

Qualifications

- A minimum of a Master's degree in Social Work, Psychology, Education, or other Human Services field from an accredited university or college program
- Must be registered, or eligible to be registered, within a professional association in Manitoba
- 5+ years of experience in; diagnosing and treatment planning, counseling, health and wellness
- Computer skills in MS Office, Google suite
- Demonstrated written and verbal communication skills, including the use of diplomacy and discretion
- Exceptional organization and management of deadlines with changing priorities
- High regard for the protection of confidential information and a high standard of ethics in handling sensitive information and situations
- Ability to work independently and within a team environment.
- Clear Current Child Abuse Registry and Criminal Record Check
